

Spanish Wills & Probate Information Sheet

In Spain, the **notary** (*notario*) plays an important role in helping clients to deal with Wills & Probate issues.

A copy of the **death certificate** can be obtained from the notary or from the Civil Registry Office (*Registro Civil*).

Apply to the General Registry of Last Wills (*Registro General de Actos de Última Voluntad*) for a **certificate** indicating whether or not the deceased made a will.



Main types of Spanish will:

- Open will** (*testamento abierto*): a will made in the presence of a notary
- Closed will** (*testamento cerrado*): a sealed will written by the testator privately
- Holographic will** (*testamento ológrafo*): a handwritten unwitnessed will

Key concept: Forced Heirship (sucesión forzosa)

Under Spanish law, a testator is required to leave a proportion of their estate to certain specific relatives known as forced heirs (*herederos forzosos*).

Forced heirs:

- Children and descendants** (grandchildren)
- Parents and ascendants** (grandparents)
- Surviving spouse**



Key concept: Usufruct

The surviving spouse has the right of usufruct over part of the estate, whereby they can remain in the family home until death.

Example of distribution of a Spanish estate where there are children:

Reserved portion (<i>legítima</i>) 1/3	Additional discretionary share (<i>mejora</i>) 1/3	Freely disposable share (<i>tercio de libre disposición</i>) 1/3

Key concept: Intestacy (sucesión intestada)

If someone dies without making a will, the rules of intestacy apply. The order of priority of entitlement is as follows:

- Children** (and grandchildren)
- Parents** (and grandparents)
- Surviving spouse**
- Siblings/nephews and nieces**
- State**

Beneficiaries of a Spanish estate may **accept** or **reject** the inheritance.
